


A place to call home

Foundation Studies Programs

Designed in conjunction with the University of Adelaide specifically for international students, our Foundation Studies Programs provide you with a pathway to follow your dream of studying business, IT, engineering, medicine, nursing and much more at the University of Adelaide. If your grades need a boost, we are here to help!



Our Foundation Studies Programs are suitable if you:

- Have completed the equivalent of Australian Year 11
- · Missed out on direct entry to the University of Adelaide
- Want to study at the University of Adelaide.

Program benefits

- · For students studying in Adelaide, once you achieve your required progression score, you are guaranteed entry to your packaged degree, and, for most bachelor's degrees, you won't need to provide any further English language evidence.
- For students studying in Melbourne, after completing your Foundation Studies Program, you will continue your pathway studies as a University of Adelaide College student undertaking a Degree Transfer Program.
- We will ensure that you understand all the additional entry requirements for dentistry, oral health, medicine, nursing, physiotherapy, occupational therapy, speech pathology and veterinary science.
- The University will issue you a packaged Confirmation of Enrolment for the entire duration of study at the College and the University.
- You will have the flexibility of studying a standard (34 teaching weeks) or accelerated (31 teaching weeks) Foundation Studies Program. In addition to weekly attendance in classes, students are also expected to complete 20-25 hours per week of independent learning.

Document certification

All academic documents, professional qualifications and English translations of these documents MUST be original documents or certified as a true copy of the original.

Every page of the document must contain all of the following elements:

- An original stamp bearing the name of the person or organisation who verifies the document
- Words in English to the effect of "I certify that this is a true copy of the original"
- An original signature
- The date of certification

Agents who are representing the College have the authority to sight original documents and provide certified, electronic copies when submitting the application. Agent certification must comply with the certification requirements listed above.

The following people can certify documents lodged with student applications:

- · An official agent or representative of the College when representing the applicant
- An authorised staff member of the College or Kaplan
- A Justice of the Peace
- A Notary Public
- A Consular Official
- A Commissioner for taking Affidavits
- The registrar of the institution that the transcript or parchment is from
- A police officer
- An examining authority

Direct applications

You can apply directly via the Applicant Portal of our Application System. You will be asked to register in the Applicant Portal. You can then commence your application for a program and save your application at any point before submitting. If you have an application saved or submitted in the Applicant Portal, you can login to do the following:

Applicants under the age of 18

If you will be under the age of 18 when you commence your studies at the College, you must meet special conditions, as specified by the Department of Home Affairs, to be eligible to be granted a student visa. You may live with an eligible relative as defined by the Department of Home Affairs, or enter into a Guardianship Arrangement with the College.
