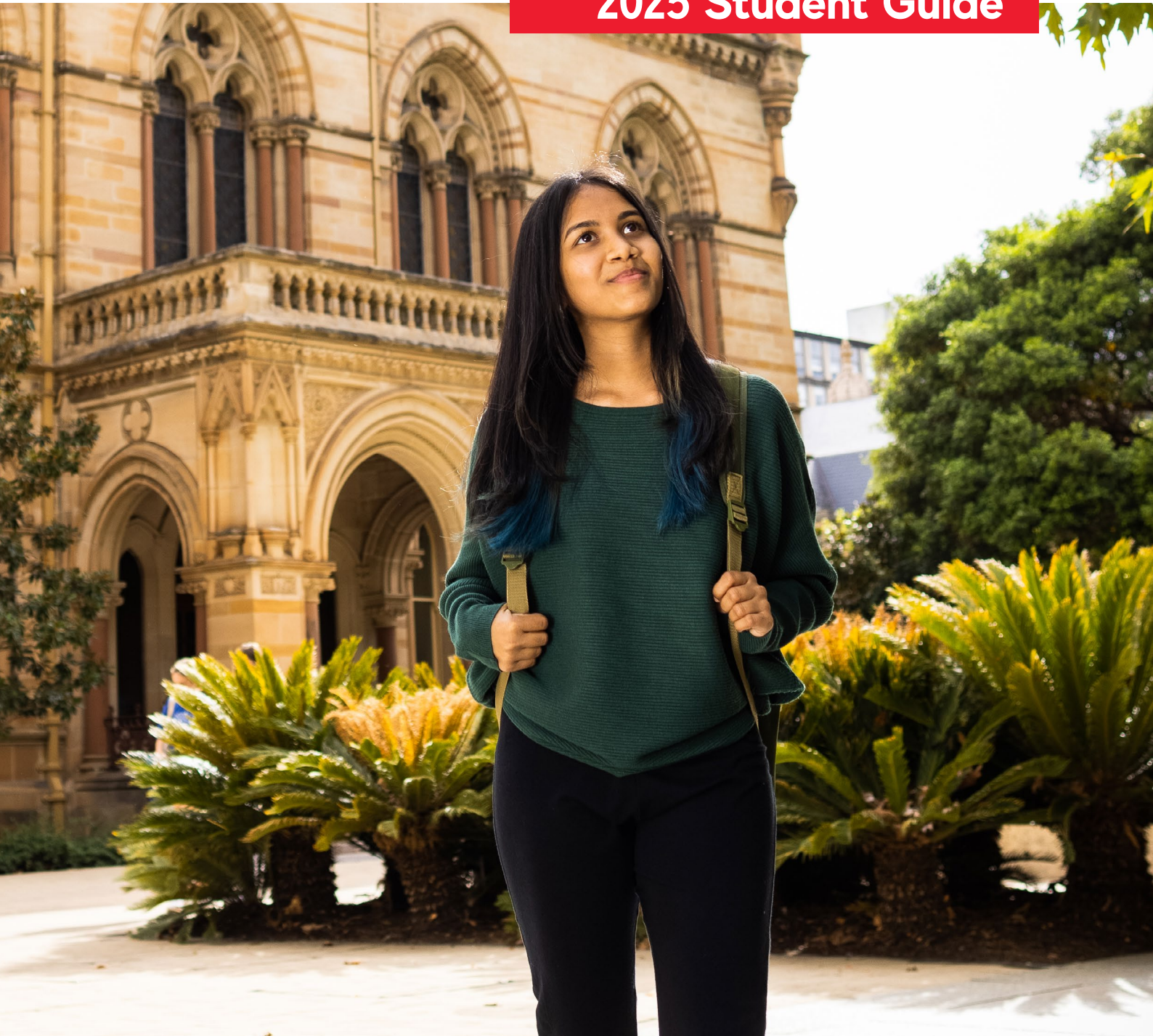

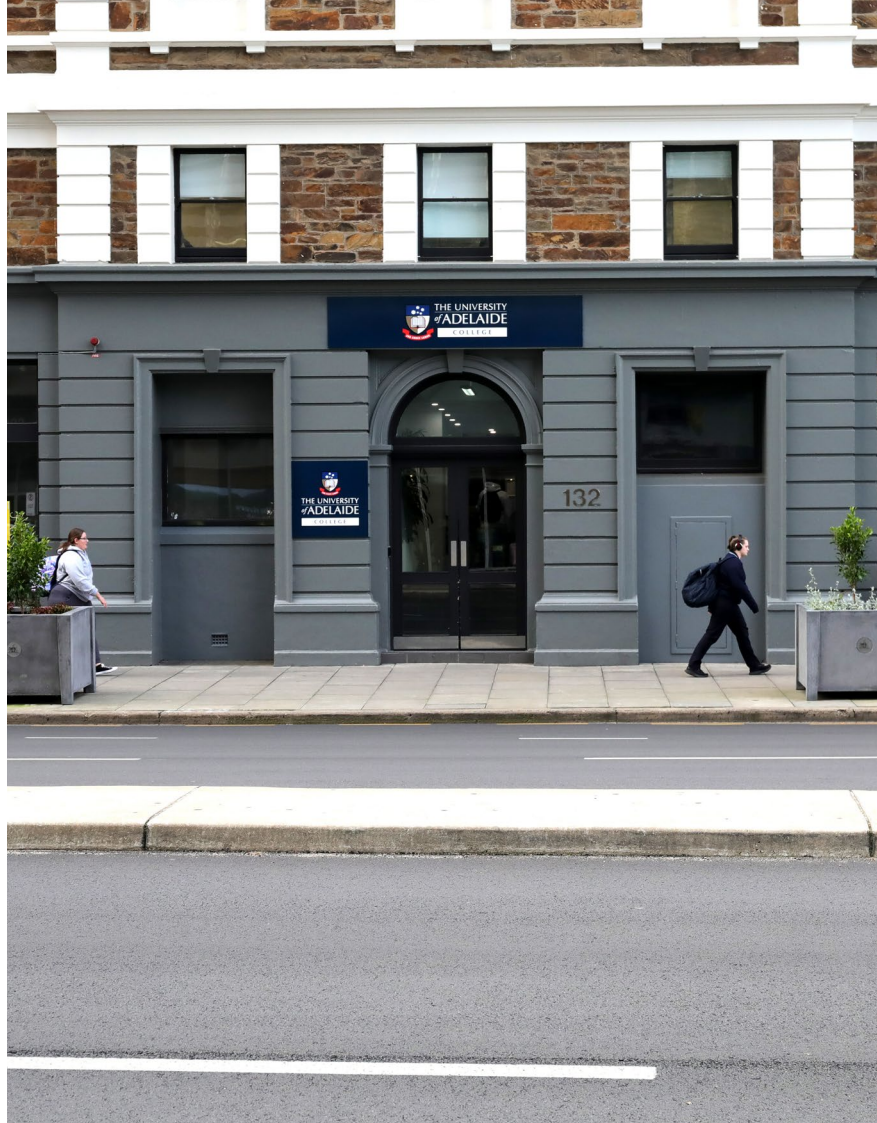

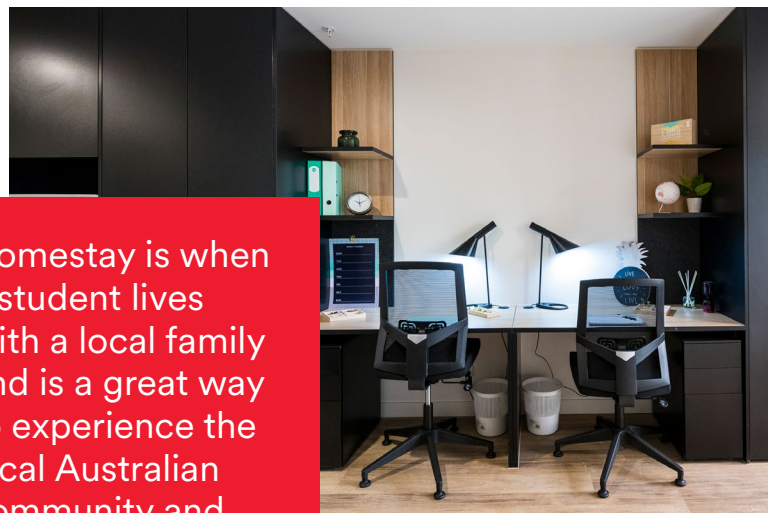


A place to call home

Accommodation plays an important part in creating a solid foundation for your academic success and personal growth.

Maybe you will want to try staying with an Australian family, for a full cultural experience. Or perhaps, you'd like to live in a shared house with friends. If you want some privacy and quiet, you might prefer your own studio apartment.

If you require assistance with this, one of our College Services Advisors can help connect you with a variety of our approved student accommodation options including homestay through the AHN network, or dedicated student accommodation at either Scape@University of Adelaide or Yugo Adelaide City so you can work out what will best suit your needs and budget. Students who are over 18 years of age have a wider range of student accommodation options and may also choose to explore private rental options.



Homestay is when a student lives with a local family and is a great way to experience the local Australian community and culture while developing your English skills.



Are you under the age of 18?

Our friendly staff look after all students at the College, but we do take particular care of students who are under the age of 18. Before you arrive, we will help you to arrange airport transfer, suitable accommodation, either with a local homestay family, or an apartment at our approved under 18 providers, Scape or Yugo.

You will have a Student Advocate appointed to support you and oversee your welfare. This service is provided by the International Student Alliance (ISA) as part of our independent welfare monitoring program. The ISA Student Advocates are professional, multilingual advocates who will meet with our younger students regularly to make sure you are properly cared for and settling into your new life in Australia.

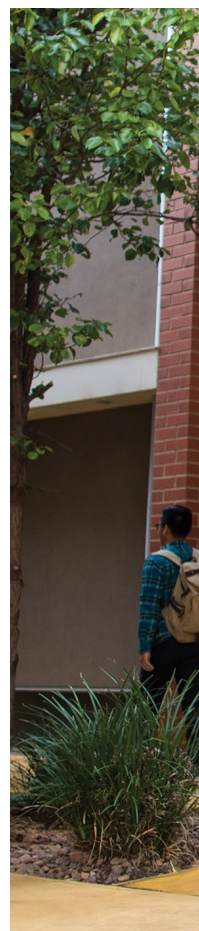

Students commencing at the College in 2025 will have guaranteed entry into the new Adelaide University upon successful completion of the their Foundation Studies Program.

Our Foundation Studies Programs are suitable if you:

- Have completed the equivalent of Australian Year 11
- Missed out on direct entry to university
- Want to study at Adelaide University.

Program benefits

- Once you achieve your required progression score, you are guaranteed entry to your packaged degree, and, for most bachelor's degrees, you won't need to provide any further English language evidence.
- We will ensure that you understand all the additional entry requirements for medicine or dentistry.
- The University will issue you a packaged Confirmation of Enrolment for the entire duration of study at the College and the University.
- You will have the flexibility of studying a standard (34 teaching weeks) or accelerated (31 teaching weeks) Foundation Studies Program. In addition to weekly attendance in classes, students are also expected to complete 20-25 hours per week of independent learning.

- Step 1** Complete biology, chemistry or maths as prerequisite subjects. Our Student Services team can help you select your Foundation Studies prerequisite subjects.
- Step 2** Achieve the progression score for your preferred degree – again we can confirm this with you.
- Step 3** Achieve the English proficiency score. IELTS is the preferred testing system and a minimum score of 7.0 overall, all bands 7.0 is required.
- Step 4** Register for the University Clinical Aptitude Test (UCAT ANZ).
- Step 5** Submit an online application to Adelaide University.
- Step 6** Sit the University Clinical Aptitude Test (UCAT ANZ).
- Step 7** Learn of your interview eligibility. This is based on your UCAT ANZ performance. During September you will receive an email from Adelaide University with important information and next steps.
- Step 8** Sit your 20-minute interview. Our College Services team will coach and prepare you for this. Interviews are usually scheduled for late September to October.
- Step 9** Time for offers. If you are successful, offers will be sent by Adelaide University between October and February.

How to apply

Applying to the University of Adelaide College is simple and can be completed in a few steps.

Applications through agents and representatives

Eligible agents and representatives will be redirected to the Partner Portal of our Application System to submit your application. All of our registered agents and representatives will be registered as users of the Partner Portal. Agents can start, save and submit applications in the Partner Portal.

Document certification

All academic documents, professional qualifications and English translations of these documents **MUST** be original documents or certified as a true copy of the original.

Every page of the document must contain all of the following elements:

- An original stamp bearing the name of the person or organisation who verifies the document
- Words in English to the effect of "I certify that this is a true copy of the original"
- An original signature
- The date of certification

Agents who are representing the College have the authority to sight original documents and provide certified, electronic copies when submitting the application. Agent certification must comply with the certification requirements listed above.

The following people can certify documents lodged with student applications:

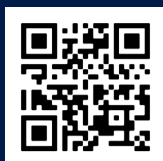
- An official agent or representative of the College when representing the applicant
- An authorised staff member of the College or Kaplan
- A Justice of the Peace
- A Notary Public
- A Consular Official
- A Commissioner for taking Affidavits
- The registrar of the institution that the transcript or parchment is from
- A police officer
- An examining authority

Direct applications

You can apply directly via the Applicant Portal of our Application System. You will be asked to register in the Applicant Portal. You can then commence your application for a program and save your application at any point before submitting.

If you have an application saved or submitted in the Applicant Portal, you can login to do the following:

- Retrieve, edit and submit an application
- Upload documents
- Accept and pay for an Offer of Admission

Offer of Admission

- Program names

- Commencement dates
- Tuition fees
- Acceptance and payment deadlines
- Conditions – if you have a conditional offer, the conditions are clearly outlined in your offer of admission. Conditions may include providing proof of English Language Proficiency, completion of academic qualifications, or provision of official documents (e.g. original or certified copies of your documents).

Accepting your offer

How to accept your offer

See the acceptance process outlined below. Following this process and correctly completing the required forms will ensure the smooth and efficient processing of your acceptance and the issuing of your CoE (Confirmation of Enrolment).

You can accept a conditional offer by providing evidence of meeting all conditions together with your completed acceptance.

Step 1 Offer of Admission

Accept your Offer of Admission in the Applicant Portal of our Application System. If you have a nominated agent or representative, please be in touch with them to finalise your acceptance, in conjunction with accepting in the Applicant Portal.

Ensure that your personal details in the Applicant Portal match your passport and upload into the Applicant Portal a copy of the personal ID page and signature page in your passport.

If you have a conditional offer, the conditions will be outlined in your Offer of Admission. Please fulfil all conditions listed on your Offer of Admissions (if any).

Step 2 Fees

Payment can be made in the Applicant Portal of the Application System via the College's preferred online payment provider, Flywire.

Step 3 Visas

Contact your nearest Australian Embassy, Consulate or High Commission or the Department of Home Affairs office about the process to apply for your Australian Student Visa.

Step 4 Personal details

Make sure your personal details are up to date in your Applicant Portal in the College Application System (e.g. a copy of the personal ID page and signature page in your passport) so that your CoE can be correctly issued.

Step 5 Confirmation of enrolment

Your CoE will be emailed to you or to your nominated agent or representative after the College has received acceptance of your Offer of Admissions via the Applicant Portal and all relevant fees paid.

Step 6 Apply for visa

Once you have received your CoE you will be able to lodge your student visa. To do this, you or your College agent or representative will need to create an ImmiAccount at immi.homeaffairs.gov.au/help-support/applying-online-or-on-paper/online
