
















Relentlessly progressive

Our Foundation Studies Program is suitable if you:

- Have completed the equivalent of Australian Year 11
- · Missed out on direct entry to the University of Adelaide
- Want to study at the University of Adelaide.

Program benefits

- · For students studying in Adelaide, once you achieve your required progression score, you are guaranteed entry to your packaged degree, and, for most bachelor's degrees, you won't need to provide any further English language evidence.
- For students studying in Melbourne, after completing your Foundation Studies Program, you will continue your pathway studies as a University of Adelaide College student undertaking a Degree Transfer Program.
- We will ensure that you understand all the additional entry requirements for dentistry, oral health, medicine, nursing, physiotherapy, occupational therapy, speech pathology and veterinary science.
- The University will issue you a packaged Confirmation of Enrolment for the entire duration of study at the College and the University.
- You will have the flexibility of studying a standard (34 teaching weeks) or accelerated (31 teaching weeks) Foundation Studies Program. In addition to weekly attendance in classes, students are also expected to complete 20-25 hours per week of independent learning.

At the University of Adelaide College, we are here to assist students in pursuing their dream of studying a health degree. You will be offered a packaged degree with either a Bachelor of Health and Medical Sciences or a Bachelor of Science (Biomedical Science) when you commence your Foundation Studies Program with us.

Once you are studying at the College, we are here to guide and coach you, to help you gain admission to your preferred health degree.

Unique College support to prepare you

We've created an exclusive range of services to help you gain admission to the health degree of your choice. This includes:

- Information session with guest speakers and alumni
- Online 'how to apply' tutoring session
- Assistance in applying for the University Critical Aptitude Test (UCAT ANZ)

Progressing from your packaged degree to medicine, dentistry or oral health

To follow your dream of studying a Bachelor of Health and Medical Studies, Bachelor of Dental Surgery or Bachelor of Oral Health, there are additional requirements needed so you can progress from the College to the University of Adelaide.

These steps will give you an understanding of what's involved:

- Step 1 Complete biology, chemistry or maths as prerequisite subjects. Our Student Services team can help you select your Foundation Studies prerequisite subjects.
- Step 2 Achieve the progression score for your preferred degree - again we can confirm this with you!
- Step 3 Achieve the English proficiency score. IELTS is the preferred testing system and a minimum score of 7.0 overall, all bands 7.0 is required.
- Step 4 Register for the University Clinical Aptitude Test (UCAT ANZ).
- Step 5 Submit an online application to the University of Adelaide.
- Step 6 Sit the University Clinical Aptitude Test (UCAT ANZ).
- Step 7 Learn of your interview eligibility. This is based on your UCAT ANZ performance. During September you will receive an email from the University of Adelaide with important information and next steps.
- Step 8 Sit your 20-minute interview! Our Student Services team will coach and prepare you for this. Interviews are usually scheduled for late September to October.
- Step 9 Time for offers! If you are successful, offers will be sent by the University of Adelaide between October and February.



To progress from your Foundation Studies Program at the College to a Bachelor of Physiotherapy (Honours) or Bachelor of Occupational Therapy (Honours) at the University of Adelaide, you will need to study prerequisite subjects, achieve the required progression score for your preferred degree and achieve an IELTS minimum score of 7.0 overall, and at least 7.0 in all bands. A Bachelor of Speech Pathology (Honours) requires an IELTS of 8 in every band, 8 overall.

Veterinarians are dedicated to maintaining the wellbeing of animals. They are scientists, surgeons, carers, and lifelong learners. Our Bachelor of Science (Veterinary Bioscience) is ranked 49th in the world for veterinary sciences and has a Five Star Excellence in Research Australia ranking[^].

To progress from your Foundation Studies Program at the College to a Bachelor of Science (Veterinary Bioscience) at the University, you will need to study prerequisite subjects and achieve the required progression score. As part of the application process, you will be required to complete and submit a prescribed questionnaire. Applicants will need to outline their experience with animals and upload supporting documentation for the information provided.

The School of Animal and Veterinary Sciences at the University will assess the questionnaire and determine if an applicant will progress to the interview stage of the admissions process.
